What is the difference between a Best-Ball and a Scramble???

Many golfers get confused regarding the different names for golf events, so here are the definitions (and other information) about these types of events:

Best Ball This is the most misused term in golf; most people confuse a Best-Ball with a Scramble. ***Best-Ball is a team event where you play your own golf ball all the way out and subtract your handicap strokes as they fall on the scorecard.*** Best-Ball events may consist of teams of 2-4 players and held in any combination: 1 Net Best-Ball of 4, 2 Net Best-Balls of 4, etc.

Progressive Best-Ball This Best-Ball event Progresses from Par 3s to Par 5s. Usually, it is used with 1 Net Best-Ball on par 3's, 2 Net Best-Balls on Par 4s and 3 Net Best-Balls on Par 5's.

Scramble Also known as a ***Texas 4-Ball***, Scrambles are the most used for non-profit fundraising golf tournaments. Every player tees off, the best drive is selected, and every player plays from this spot. This procedure is used until the ball is holed. Sometimes, individuals are required to use a certain number of drives. For example, it may be required that every person's drive must be used 2 times. This is called a ***Selective Drive Scramble***.

Scotch Another name for Scotch is an **Alternate Shot**. Usually played in 2'somes, One player is selected to drive on even numbered holes and the other will drive on odd numbered holes. After teeing off, the second player plays the second shot. After he/she plays the second shot, the first player plays the third shot. This continues until the ball is holed.

Florida Usually this format is used in Couples Golf Tournaments. All players
Shamble tee off. The best drive is selected, and the golfer whose shot was used sits out the next shot. The other players in the group hit the next shot, and the same process is followed. Once on the green, all players in the group will putt. If there are 4 people in the group, all 4 tee off, only 3 hit from the fairway or rough, and all 4 people putt.
